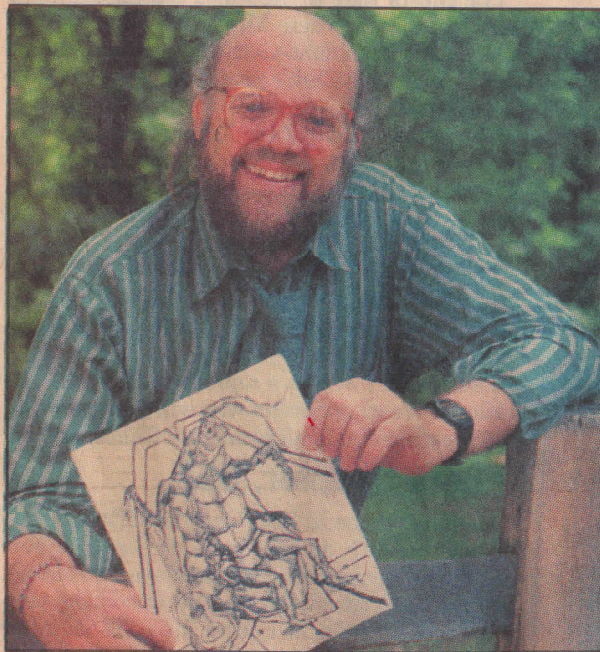

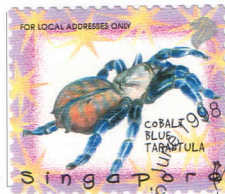
■ Combat trooper bringing exotic hissing African roaches for students to pet in unique biology lesson.

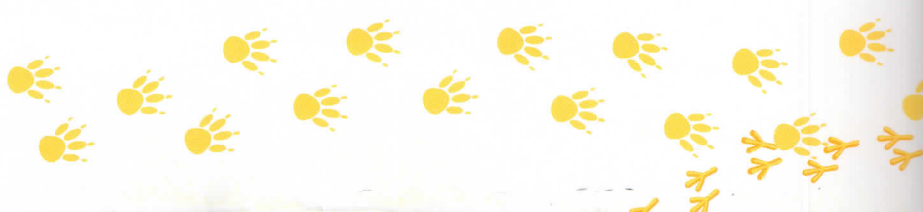
African cockroaches will be hissing their way into the hearts of students at St. Andrew's Episcopal School today.

"I'll hold them and let the kids pet them," Michael Bohdan, field director for Combat Roach Control Center in Clifton, N.J., said of the exotic roaches that are about four inches long and an inch thick. "I'll sit at a table and the kids will just crowd around me."

Bohdan's visit is part of an educational program sponsored by the makers of Combat Roach Control System. The program, which is being implemented in cities where roaches are household pests, not pets, teaches students the life cycle and habits of the insects and techniques for getting rid of them.
